Guidance on LGBT Inclusive Education

The Scottish Government has published Guidance on LGBT Inclusive Education for education settings in Scotland.

The guidance reaffirms the National Approach to LGBT Inclusive Education in Scotland and provides key information for schools about education and curriculum, responding to incidents of prejudice-based bullying, and the availability of the national professional learning and resources.

The publication of the guidance fulfils a recommendation made in 2018 by the LGBT Inclusive Education Working Group, of which NASUWT is member, for the Scottish Government to:

'develop National Guidance which clearly states expectations regarding LGBT Inclusive Education and signposts teachers in any school in Scotland towards supporting resources.'
